

## **Finnish teachers feedback from Civitavecchia workshop**

### What was good:

- seminar lectures for teachers were interesting and there was something to learn
- historical sites were very interesting both in Civitavecchia and Rome
- the possibility to learn about Italian, Spanish and German cultures and about their educational systems in a practical way by discussing with the teachers
- the study visit to the bank was very interesting
- it was nice to gain new contacts/to meet already familiar teachers
- to learn Italian culture, food, timetables etc.

### What was not so good:

- the timetable was always very confusing: nothing started when it was supposed to start, lot of waiting and nobody told what was going to happen

- there should have been some theoretical lessons for students before they started to prepare their business ideas. Maybe the Italian students had that information already, but it seemed that they had not told it properly to their group members.

### Ideas for making it better next time:

- teachers seminar could have had more learning by doing for the teachers too (activities, not lectures)
- more information from the organizing school to all teachers: this way teachers are able to tell their students the plan for the day.
- taking care that the timetable keeps
- visit to Bank in Rome could have been reflected with the students in the following day
- planning is important
- if we had idea of host families, the organizing school should respect that and organize hosts.
